Being a Man under Authority

Titus 3:1 Remind them to be subject to rulers, to authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good deed.

Difficulties within the church are rarely found in matters of **outward disobedience**; mostly difficulties within the church are related due to a lack of **inward submission**.

Only three times in the gospels does Jesus say He is **amazed**. in parallel passages, Matthew 8:10 and Luke 7:9 and in Mark 6:6.

Only twice in the gospels does Christ commend a person for great faith. Matthew 15:28 and Luke 7:3.

Luke 7:1

When He had completed all His discourse in the hearing of the people, He went to Capernaum.

Luke 7:2

And a centurion's slave, who was highly regarded by him, was sick and about to die.

Luke 7:3

Luke 7:8b
